CISA Update: APS response to Ukraine/Russia - Alan Hurd

Hurd discussed the APS response to Ukraine, the recommendations from CISA and actions that have been taken since the recommendations.

The recommendations were derived through deliberations by the members of CISA, along with three former CISA Chairs who are currently serving on the CISA Subcommittee, "Establishing APS as a Welcoming Global Hub." In addition, CISA members discussed actions APS should take in support of displaced and dissenting Russian and Belarusian scientists. A few overarching principles guided CISA's deliberations, and these are echoed in the recommendations below: *See Slides*

02.5 Boycott of Scientists by Nationality - Discussion

Demers gave an overview of 02.5 Boycott of Scientists by Nationality - The P&P subcommittee wanted to broaden the statement with the same sentiments. The subcommittee decided to take the long view and thought about including other nationalities. POPA discussed the need to distinguish between boycotts based on nationality on the one hand and on the other, decisions to end or suspend relationships with nationally sponsored institutions. POPA is very much in favor of broadening the statement. P&P will work on the statement to present in October.

02.1 DOD Funding for Basic Research *

Demers presented the committee with an updated statement containing minor edits to the statement put forward by the P&P Subcommittee. The committee proceeded to vote on the new statement after a short discussion.
