- Provides mini-grants for physics education activities.
- Co-sponsors with one APS Division a session at a national AAPT meeting.
- Co-sponsors selected conferences on physics education.

Members of the Forum are active participants in the APS/AAPT Physics Teacher Education Coalition programs (PhysTEC and PTEC) and in the Doubling Initiative.

Over 10% of APS members belong to the Forum on Education.
